

Graduate Level Credit from University of the Pacific – One two or three semester hours of post-baccalaureate credit, directly through the University of the Pacific, Center for Professional and Continuing Education, will be awarded upon successful completion of course requirements. Practicum participation requires 15 hours, per credit, of separate follow-up. Designed to meet the needs of educators for professional upgrading and salary advancement, these Professional Development Courses are for graduate participants who are NOT pursuing an advanced degree at University of the Pacific. Acceptable where local districts approve and applicable to state licensing where authorized. Letter graded. Tuition fees are nonrefundable. University of the Pacific (California's oldest chartered university, established – 1851) is fully accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges.

Course Requirements: Step One - 1) Following the seminar, plan practical activities or strategies of your choice, based on the information presented, and develop in a form that can lead to practical implementation in a present or future classroom or program. Formats may include, but are not limited to, worksheets, lesson plans, center activities, bulletin boards, displays, etc. 2) Participants must plan and develop at least THREE complete activities or strategies (during their 15 hours of participation) for EACH unit of CREDIT attempted. Step Two – 1) Prepare a narrative report to demonstrate the actual, or planned, implementation of these practical activities or strategies to a present or future classroom or program. 2) For each activity, include the Source, description, utilization and objectives of the activity/strategy. 3) Report must consist of a minimum THREE full pages for each credit attempted, single spaced, covering the appropriate number of activities/strategies, with a minimum of three activities/strategies for each credit. Step 3 – Prepare a title page Step 4 – 1) Submit your report within four months of the enrollment date via mail, unless an extension has been requested. 2) Grades: Coursework meeting all criteria and received by due date will receive the appropriate letter grade.
